Kia ora Tatou,

It is certainly nice to see the sun again and be able to get our tamariki outside during the day. The students are showing their great levels of responsibility and resilience; managing their hats, masks, large bags and heavy drink bottles. Thanks so much for **only coming into the school grounds if it is essential.** We are noticing that many students are showing increasing levels of resilience, being happy to come in and managing themselves well - tino pai tamariki. The Ministry of Education, along with the Ministry of Health are supporting schools to manage any Covid situations that may come our way. While we are confident that our current plan is enabling us to stay on-site, the situation could arise when we have to have some students and staff at home or close the school. We have managed this before and we have good systems ready to roll out. We have the capacity to share devices and hard packs if needed. If this was to happen, you could be prepared for this by considering having access to some resources. You could visit the library and have at home a good supply of books. Also, consider getting age-appropriate colouring books, number/word puzzle books like dot-to-dot or word finds, pencils, pens etc.

Whānau and Kaiako Hui - Parent and Teacher Meetings online

The purpose of our Whānau and Kaiako Hui - Parent and Teacher Meetings, at this early stage of the year is to let your child's teacher know anything that you think would be helpful for them about your child. With the increasing number of confirmed or Covid cases around us, we will now provide non-contact ways to ensure this important information is still passed on.


Junior Tough Guy & Gal Challenge - Wainuiomata
