We are currently carrying out the process of making up classes for 2022. This is a very considered process that staff put a lot of effort and thought into placements.

For 2022 we have a complication with our Year 6 classes of too many students for one class and not enough students for two classes in order to maintain our organisation that has currently been in place. To accommodate, there will be 15-17 Year 5 students who will be placed in our Year 5 and 6 classes. We will be selecting these students based on the potential for social connections and the individual skills for learning that we have observed. We have not considered any academic achievement levels as a basis for deciding which Year 5 students will be placed in a Year 4 and 5 or Year 5 and 6 class.

I have received a TeachNZ award of a Principal's Sabbatical for Term 1. I will be researching, and visiting schools to see how wellbeing is supported with a view to how we can have a school-wide system and organisational approach to wellbeing for our students, staff and community.

Steph Campbell will act as Principal for Term 1 and Martin Hodge will be released in his leadership role for Term 1. Martin will then open a New Entrant Classroom as the year progresses and Steph will work part-time in our Year 5 and 6 class from Term 2.
